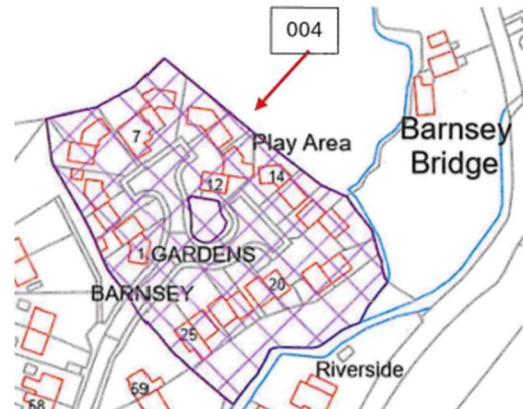




## 004: Barnsey Gardens, TQ13 7GA

- car park.
- As Teignbridge appear to neglect play areas/open spaces in Ashburton.
- Play areas essential for child development.
- Essential to keep play areas.
- A play area with a good selection of activities is essential in a family housing
- situation, but well-structured communal areas with green space (however small) and
- some seating are communal, social and developmental.
- Play areas are obviously good to have. Maybe make them more natural so they are
- not as expensive to maintain?
- Can volunteers maintain it? Children need somewhere to play.
- Well used almost all the time, so upkeep and refurbishment - have to accept
- responsibility.
- Children's mental health demands open space.
- Keep as a community asset for the nearby children.
- Needs to be retained for play, but consider what equipment is best suited to the
- location.
- Needs to be maintained as a safe play space, not to clutter space for small children.
- Should be maintained for children.
- Play areas should be maintained, but it's not very good at the moment.
